

## GENERAL REGULATIONS OF THE 2023 SGAM MINERALOGICAL FAIR

1. Exhibitors are solely responsible for their merchandise. The organizers accept no liability for theft, breakage or any other damage.
2. Any person in connection with damage caused to the premises made available or their accesses is required to report immediately to the President Bourse and the Ramada staff.
3. Exhibitors organize themselves so that their stand is ready for the opening of the Stock Exchange. They do not give up their place before the Stock Exchange closes but must leave the exhibition hall no later than Sunday evening at 7:30 p.m. Spaces not occupied up to 15 minutes before the opening and without prior justification may be reallocated without compensation.
4. The following are authorized on the pitches reserved for rough stones: natural minerals and fossils in their raw state; the accessories used for their extraction, collection and determination; the library dealing with mineralogy, polished stones in slices and polished amber.
5. Are authorized on the spaces reserved for other shaped stones: jewelry made with natural minerals or fossils; cut, polished, mounted or enhanced natural stones (balls, rolled stones, eggs, various shapes) as well as the tools and machines used for their shaping.
6. Are prohibited on the Bourse: historical artefacts (flint, arrowheads, etc.); synthetic minerals or minerals from residues of human activity (fordite type, slag, carborundum, electrolytic bismuth, etc.); objects having no connection with mineralogy, gemology or paleontology (ivory, wood, leather, coral, shells, enamels, coins, mother-of-pearl or Florentine beads, clocks, etc.), as well as those whose appearance mineral is secondary (caps, bottles of gold leaf, statuettes encrusted with stones, stamped metals, utilitarian objects with stone parts, etc.).
7. Dyed, synthetic, repaired, glued or treated parts by physical or chemical means (irradiation, temperature, etc.) must imperatively be marked and indicated as such (heated amethyst, bombarded quartz, etc.), as well as the repolished crystals.
8. Radioactive or toxic minerals and asbestos are designated as such and presented in closed boxes.
9. Exhibitors must clearly indicate the name and exact provenance of the minerals and fossils they exhibit. The display of effective prices is mandatory for all goods intended for sale (in Swiss francs). Mentions of sales or discounts are prohibited. Parts that are not for sale bear an indication to that effect. Any inscription linking exposed minerals to health benefits is prohibited.
10. Exhibitors are required to observe the directives given by the organizers as well as the standards in force for this type of event.
11. The tables available to exhibitors measure 160 / 80 cm. The use of personal tables is prohibited.
12. Exhibitors must have a personal electrical installation that complies with the safety standards in force in the canton of Geneva. "Daylight" bulbs are the only means of lighting authorized (no modification or reinforcement of colours). U.V. bulbs are accepted for fluorescent mineral installations.

13. In the event of a pandemic, exhibitors must meet the requirements of the organizers, as well as the state health requirements in force in Geneva (vaccines, tests, etc.).

14. Exhibitors can obtain a maximum of the same number of tables as the previous year, as long as their registration reaches the Company before September 20, by means of a duly completed form. After this period, the allocation of stands is done in the order of registration and can be reduced to a single table per exhibitor. The location is only definitively allocated after receipt of payment by September 30 at the latest. In the event of non-participation, the payment remains acquired by the Company. Assignment or subletting is prohibited.

15. The control commission appointed by the SGAM reserves the right and is the only one empowered to rule on the application of these regulations, to settle without appeal all the cases that it deems contentious with, if necessary, immediate expulsion and denunciation to the of the ASCMF. Any intervention by a service due to non-compliance is invoiced to the offending exhibitor.

16. The exhibitor undertakes to comply with these regulations. In the event of a dispute, only the French version of the rules is authentic. Swiss law is applicable.
